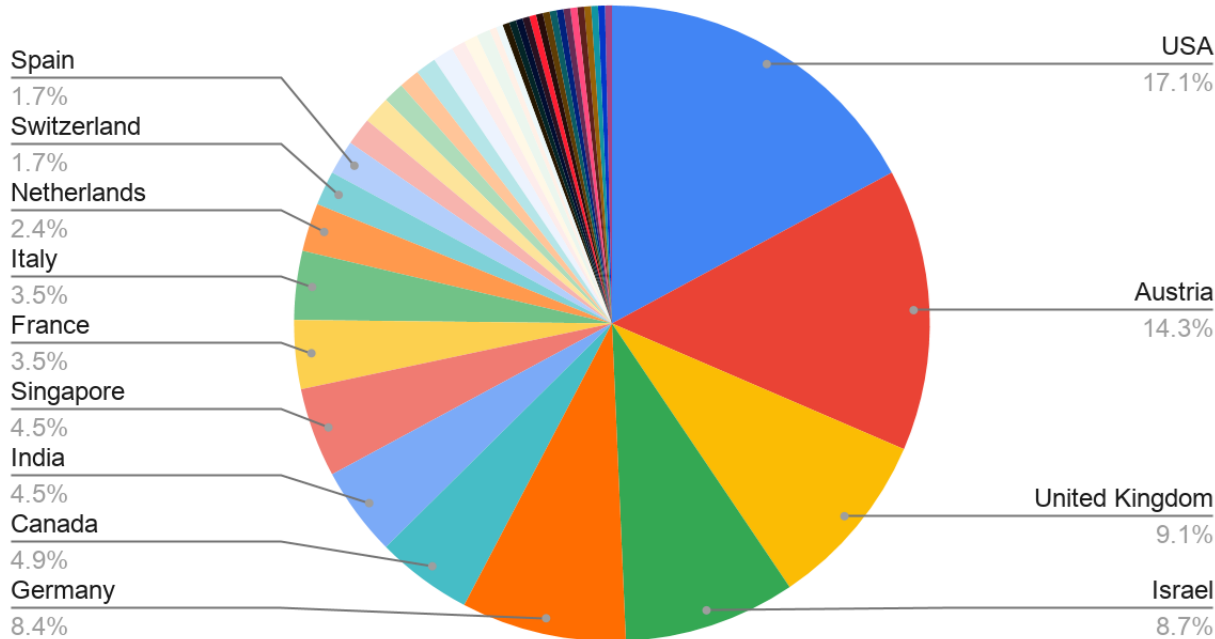
# Welcome!

- 5 4 invited talks from leading experts in Android security who graciously agreed to give an overview of their recent work
